Dear Ms. Gregory:

Enclosed please find 17 pages of records in response to your request under the Wisconsin Public Records Law (Wis. Stat. 19.31, et seq.). The request was made in your letter to Dr. Donna Paulnock dated June 1, 2010.

Marmoset cj1654 has enjoyed the full benefit of the WNPRC's environmental enrichment program since his birth. He has benefited from being raised with his parents in the presence of his siblings. Additionally, he is housed in an enclosure with ample climbing apparatus that simulate an arboreal environment, a variety of manipulanda, and is frequently provided with opportunities to perform species specific behaviors such as foraging for a variety of food items. The enclosed cage wash and enrichment records for cj1654's housing room demonstrate that he has consistently received environmental enhancements as mandated by the Animal Welfare Act and its regulations.

There is limited information redacted from the enclosed records which references the specific location where research animals are housed and research is conducted. A specific determination has been made that removing this information is necessary to protect research activities from criminal interference. (Wis. Stat. §19.35(1)(a), incorporating §19.85(1)(d)). Furthermore, under the Balancing Test inherent in the public records law, the public interest in protecting animal research facilities from criminal interference outweighs the public interest in knowing the exact locations of research animals and activities. In addition, personally identifiable information regarding employees is redacted per §19.35(1)(a) and (am)2.a. Furthermore, under the Balancing Test inherent in the Public Records Law, we have made the specific determination that the public interest in preventing harassment of staff outweighs the negligible public interest in knowing the specific staff involved with particular animals or research. Also redacted is a University "intranet" web site address. This is a restricted-access site which contains proprietary raw research data and other information exempt from the Public Records law that could be subject to disclosure or alteration if unauthorized individuals gained access. We have determined under the Balancing Test that the public interest in preventing unauthorized access to this site outweighs the public interest in knowing the designation for the web address.

In addition, to the extent that records maintained by researchers constitute unpublished proprietary research data, such records may be redacted or withheld per Wis. Stat. §19.36(5) and §19.35(1)(a), incorporating 19.85(1)(e). (A specific determination has been made that premature disclosure of this type of information interferes with the competitive position of the University.) Furthermore, under the Balancing Test inherent in the public records law, we have made the specific determination that the public interest in maintaining academic freedom of researchers to determine how and/or when their research data is published and enabling patenting of researchers' inventions outweighs the public interest in accessing unpublished data.

Please note that the Wisconsin Public Records Law applies to requests for specific records in the possession of public agencies, and does not encompass general questions submitted by members of the public. Moreover, although we are very comfortable that the University of Wisconsin-Madison adheres to the highest standards in terms of the appropriate treatment of animals used in research, answers to some of your questions would be inherently subjective and therefore could not adequately address your questions. Finally, collecting the information necessary to attempt to address your questions would be a time-consuming and expensive process, for which the University receives no funding, and which would negatively impact our ability to promptly respond to properly formulated public records requests.

The enclosed copies are being provided without charge. However, be advised that future requests may require payment of duplication, search and shipping fees as allowed under Wis. Stat. §19.35(3). An estimate of the fee will be provided prior to initiating any duplication of documents.
