Fall 2000 Nonhuman Primate Housing Survey for Animal Care

Housing Options:

#1 Pair/Group Housing:

Housing in an enclosure with one or more compatible primates conspecifics preferred for at least the majority of the primates' waking periods. In other words, the animals are in direct, unrestricted contact with other nonhuman primates at all times, or at least all waking periods. Single gender and/or limited age groups are also included here.

#2 Individual housing with contact and scheduled interactions

Housing in an enclosure without (an)other compatible primate(s), but with the animal having the opportunity for continuous visual, auditory, and olfactory contact with at least one other compatible, preferably conspecific, primate. Opportunity for tactile contact should be provided on a routine, scheduled basis (daily), unless otherwise justified by an Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee(IACUC) approved active protocol. Contact may be provided in shared social areas or through enclosure bars sufficiently spaced to provide adequate tactile contact range for grooming, while minimizing risks of injury from bites or other trauma.


#3 Individual housing without contact and with scheduled interactions


Housing without the animal having the opportunity for continuous visual, auditory, and olfactory contact, but with such contact, including tactile contact, on a routine basis, through scheduled social interaction with one or more compatible primates. See (2) above for conditions of tactile contact.


#4 No contact with other nonhuman primates

Animals housed without the opportunity for continuous or periodic visual, auditory, olfactory, and tactile contact with a compatible primate, but with a daily positive interaction with compatible human care givers. Periodic would mean more than 4 times a week for the majority of the waking period of the animal.
