Dear Dr. Peccei.

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 7, 2007 letter of a final report concerning an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) after the initial report via a phone call to this Office on April 12, 2006 by Ms. Kathy Wadsworth and your interim report of August 15, 2006. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that after review of the incident by the ARC, the Committee believes there is clear evidence that the procedures conducted by the two postdoctoral researchers were done so without the knowledge of the PI or approval of the ARC.

Corrective actions consisted of placing the two postdoctoral researchers on Investigatory Leave as of March 8, 2006. They were subsequently terminated from employment. The PI has assured the Committee that he intends to oversee all aspects of future postdoctoral researchers and will perform regular review of all study logs and other documents generated by such researchers.

OLAW understands that the protocol involved was not PHS supported, but concurs that the incident warranted reporting. The establishment and application of policies and practices that are consistent with the provisions of the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at UCLA are commendable and avoid the perception of a double standard. We appreciate being informed of the conclusion of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Animal Welfare Assurance A3196-01

Dear Dr. Wolff:

I am writing to provide you with a final report regarding an allegation of noncompliance reported to you by Associate Director Kathy Wadsworth. At that time, Ms. Wadsworth notified you that a UCLA investigator contacted her on March 6, 2006 to report that two postdoctoral researchers working in his lab had conducted research procedures on zebra fish that were not described in his ARC approved protocol. The investigator stated that the procedures were conducted "without his knowledge or planning." Further, the investigator claimed that the postdoctoral researchers submitted a manuscript for publication based on the unapproved research. Upon your advice, Ms. Wadsworth contacted the investigator to request that the manuscript be withdrawn from further consideration. It was later learned that the journal had already rejected the manuscript.

The postdoctoral researchers were put on Investigatory Leave on March 8, 2006 and are therefore no longer working with laboratory animals at UCLA. As Ms. Wadsworth also informed you, the postdoctoral researchers had contested the allegations made by the investigator and retained legal representation.

On March 12, 2007, the investigator contacted the ARC to inform them that a settlement between the University and the postdoctoral researchers was reached, and that the aforementioned postdoctoral researchers had agreed to cooperate with the investigation to provide details of their experiments. The postdoctoral researchers were subsequently terminated from employment following the University's investigation of this matter.

The Principal Investigator's final report of this incident was reviewed by the Committee during the convened meeting of April 9, 2007. The report indicated that there is clear evidence that the activities conducted by the two postdoctoral researchers were done so without the knowledge of the Principal Investigator or the approval of the ARC. The report also clarified that that unapproved activities were conducted with fish larva or very young fish (1-5 day old), which were then euthanized with tricaine methane sulfonate, in accordance with the 2000 Report of the AVMA Panel on Euthanasia.

Additionally, the Principal Investigator has assured the Committee that he intends to oversee all aspects of future postdoctoral researchers' work in his laboratory, and will perform regular review of all study logs and other documents generated by such researchers. The Committee determined that no future action was required at this time.

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your August 15, 2006 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) after the initial report via a phone call to this Office on April 12, 2006 by Ms. Kathy Wadsworth. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on March 6, 2006, a PI reported that two postdoctoral researchers working in his lab had conducted procedures on zebra fish that were not approved in his research protocol.

Corrective actions consisted of placing the two postdoctoral researchers on Investigatory Leave as of March 8, 2006, during which they are not working with laboratory animals at UCLA. It is further understood that the two researchers have retained legal representation and are contesting the allegations.

We appreciate being informed of the status of this matter. We will maintain an open file and request that UCLA provide this Office with pertinent updated information or a final report from your office when it becomes available.
